plus meet our high expectations for what our neighborhoods need.

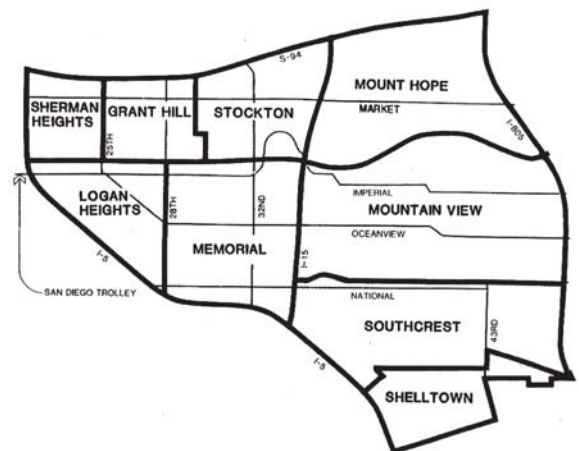
It is our chance to stop bad projects from being built.

- No planning experience necessary.
- Must be over 18 years old.
- Must either live, own a business, or own property within the Southeastern San Diego area.
- Must be available to meet for one meeting each month, on the second Monday of the month, at Neighborhood House, 841 S. 41st Street, San Diego, CA 92113, at 6:30 p.m. (Meetings end by 9:00 p.m.). We do not meet in August or December.

All people are welcome at this public meeting and may provide input on any project.

- To become a General Member of the SESDPC, you must attend three meetings within a year to be eligible to be voted in as a General Member.
- To become an SESDPC Board Member and vote at each meeting, you must first be a General Member. We are especially seek representation from Logan Heights, Memorial, Mountain View, Southcrest, and Shelltown
